HOW TO HANDLE TRESPASSERS



Shown above is an example of our club's posted sign. As the sign implies, our club has the Recreational Rights and No Trespassing is allowed by non-members as defined in the Club's Rules & Regulations. It is our responsibility as a club to handle and enforce problems associated with trespassing.

In confronting trespassers use tact, be firm but courteous. Be in control; do not create a bad scene, which could result in more than a discussion. If someone does not cooperate, follow them to their vehicle and record vehicle make and tag number. You may want to emphasize that we are responsible for taking care of this property, which includes keeping unauthorized people from entering onto the property and making sure all litter is picked up.

There are basically two types of trespass situations you may encounter. Guidelines for handling these situations are shown below. The Club Officers are to be informed of all problems and circumstances.

CONFRONTING A TRESPASSER IN PERSON

Approach the individual(s); ask him if he is aware that he is trespassing. Advise him that the Piedmont Hunt Club has the Recreational Rights to this property and that you pay for the privilege of using this property. Ask for identification; write down his name, address and date. Ask where he is parked and if possible, escort him back to his vehicle. Write down vehicle make, tag number and date. Let him know information about him has been recorded and will be turned into the Club Officers. Advise him that if he is found on the club again it may result in Legal Action.

CONFRONTING AN UNAUTHORIZED PARKED VEHICLE

Record the vehicle make, tag number and date. Leave a signed note as follows:

The Piedmont Hunt Club has the Recreational Rights to this property and if you are on, you are trespassing. I have recorded your vehicle make, tag number and date, which will be turned into the Club Officers. If your vehicle is parked on this property again it may result in Legal Action.
